


Women in Stitches

Five Financial Scams targeting older adults

- **1. Government impersonation scams** scammers call unsuspecting older adults and pretend to be from the IRS, Social Security, etc.
- 2. Sweepstakes and lottery scams Scammers call to tell them they have won the lottery or prize but want you to send them money up front to receive the prize.
- 3. Robocalls and phone scams Some scammers may say your warranty is expiring on your phone, car, etc. One common one is "Can you hear me?". When you say 'yes" the scammer may use the voice signature to charge items to you.
- **4. Computer tech support scams** scammers prey on older adults who may lack knowledge about computers and cyber security. Remember, that whether it's a phone call or website, legitimate tech support wont ever proactively seek you out to fix the issue..
- **5. The grandparent scam** this devious scam preys on our love for our grand-kids. Scammer call a would-be grandparent and say something like "Hi Grandma, do you know who this is?". When you guess the name, the scammer tries to get your trust. They might say they are a police officer arresting their grandchild and to send money.
