Council Highlights from January 2025

MOTION to accept the minutes from December 2024 was unanimously carried. **Old Business**: Food pantry have been using their own credit cards (\$2500-\$3500 per month) and being reimbursed. Discussion on solutions ensued. Finance Year to date through December, donations are \$47708.81 above spending, which includes Fellowship balance of \$8302. Through December, envelope offerings (\$15923) are below last year, plate offerings are down (\$2354.73), but mortgage offerings are up \$13276.81. Total income is down \$4985.79 compared to last year. Through year end, our expenses are \$16255.81 below our 2024 spending plan but above last year by \$15958 (2.8% increase). Council needs to determine the designation of the 10% tithe on the overage for the year, along with where the balance is to be placed. Ideas were given and the congregations will be asked. This is tabled to next month. Property Fans are being installed with remotes. Mutual Ministry Due to increase in attendance, overflow lot will be opened. A baby grand piano has being donated. An online directory is in the process of being put together. **Pastors' time** Introductions for everyone with the new council members. Your input and thoughts For Lent—40 Days of Giving New Business Council meeting dates reviewed. Correspondences Thank you notes for donations were received from Jesus Loves You (\$337.50), Crossroads (\$337.50), and Earl from Hope Academy. CARE thanked us for our support that enabled them to expand their services for children and Annette Morden for the poinsettia. Next meeting 2/19/2025.
